Step 1: Registration Form:

Register for the Online Application Form and note down the system- generated Application Number. The candidate should supply the required details while filling the Online Application Form and is also required to create a PASSWORD and choose Security Question and enter his/her Answer. After successful submission of the personal details, an Application number will be generated and it will be used to complete the remaining Steps of the Application Form and will also be required for all future reference/correspondence. For subsequent logins, the candidate will be able to login directly with the respective system-generated **Application Number** and created **Password**.

Step 2: Application Form:

The Candidates can log in with the system-generated Application Number and pre-created Password for completing the Application Form including filling up personal details, providing the details of educational qualification, university/ programme selection, test paper details, choosing the ExaminationCities, and uploading the images and documents (if any)

Upload Scanned Images of the Candidate's Photograph, Signature, Category Certificate (if applicable), and PwBD Certificate (wherever applicable):

- i. The recent photograph should be either in colour or black and white with 80% face (without mask) visible including ears against a white background.
- ii. The scanned photograph and signature should be in JPG/JPEG format (clearly legible).
- iii. The size of the scanned photograph should be between 10 kb to 200 kb (clearly legible).
- iv. The size of the scanned signature should be between 4 kb to 30 kb (clearlylegible).
- v. The size of the scanned copy of the Category certificate (SC/ST/OBC/EWSetc.) should be between **50kb to 300kb** in pdf (clearly legible).
- vi. *The size of the scanned copy of the PwBD certificate should be between **50kb to 300 kb** in pdf (clearly legible)

CHAPTER – 1 INTRODUCTION

1.1. About National Testing Agency (NTA)

The Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India (GoI) has established the National Testing Agency (NTA) as an independent, autonomous, and self-sustained premier testing organization under the Societies Registration Act (1860) for conducting efficient, transparent, and international standardized tests in order to assess the competency of candidates for admission to premier higher education institutions with a mission to improve equity and quality in education by developing and administering research-based valid, reliable, efficient, transparent, fair and international level assessments.

NTA has created a system that is promoting teaching (by teachers), learning (by students), and assessment (by parents and institutions). NTA strongly believes in the quality, efficiency, effectiveness, equity, and security of assessments. To practice these values, NTA is constantly engaging with its stakeholders, viz. students, parents, teachers, experts, and partner institutions.

The objectives of NTA, *inter alia*, include:

- 1. To conduct efficient, transparent, and international standardized tests in order to assess the competency of candidates for admission.
- 2. To undertake research on educational, professional, and testing systems to identify gaps in the knowledge systems and take steps for bridging them.
- 3. To produce and disseminate information and research on education and professional development standards.

National Testing Agency has been entrusted with the responsibility of conducting the National Common Entrance Test (NCET) for admission to **4-Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) in selected Central/State University/Institutions including IITs, NITs, RIEs, and Government Colleges for the Academic Session 2023-24.**





1.2. About National Council of Teachers Education (NCTE)

NCTE, as a statutory body under the Department of School Education & Literacy, Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India came into existence in pursuance of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 on 17th August 1995 with the mandate to achieve planned and coordinated development of teacher education throughout the country and to govern the regulation and proper maintenance of norms and standards for teacher education. The organization is a pan-India jurisdiction and comprises various divisions along with 4 Regional Council, and Western Regional Council, Eastern Regional Council, Southern Regional Council, and Western Regional Council which are all stationed in New Delhi. The gamut of functions performed by NCTE is very broad covering all the teacher education programmes e.g. Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed), Bachelor of Education (B.Ed), Master of Education (M.Ed), etc. It includes the Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) for students-teachers for equipping them to teach at the Foundational, Preparatory, Middle, and Secondary level of the new school system in alignment with NEP 2020.

1.3. About National Common Entrance Test (NCET 2023)

National Common Entrance Test (NCET) is a national-level examination conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA), on behalf of the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE). Qualifying in NCET is a mandatory requirement for seeking admission to 4 Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) in selected Central/State Universities/Institutions including IITs, NITs, RIEs, and Government Colleges for the Academic Session 2023-24.

The NCET Information Bulletin is mainly categorized into examination eligibility, application submission, examination centres, content and test components, examination pattern, marks/scores, etc. In all matters concerning NCET 2023, the decision of the NTA and NCTE will be final and binding on all the applicants.

1.3.1 Background

NEP 2020 enacts numerous changes in India's teacher education sector, one of them is as referred in para15.7: "In order to maintain uniform standards for Teacher Education, the admission to pre-service teacher preparation programmes shall be through suitable subject and aptitude test conducted by the National Testing Agency and shall be standardized keeping in view the linguistic and cultural diversity of the country".

1.3.2 Integrated Teacher Education Programme

The 4-year integrated B.Ed. will be a dual-major holistic bachelor's degree, in Education as well as a specialized subject (such as language, history, music, mathematics, computer science, chemistry, economics, art, physical-education, etc). Beyond the teaching of cutting-edge pedagogy, the teacher education will include a grounding in sociology, history, science,



psychology, early childhood care, and education, foundational literacy and numeracy, knowledge of India and its values/ethos/art/traditions, and more. [NEP 2020: 15.5]

Recognition has been granted to selected **Central/State University/Institutions which also include IITs, NITs, RIEs, and Government Colleges for Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) as envisaged in NEP 2020 from the academic session 2023-24**. The ITEP is a Dual Major Programme -the first major is in Education with School Specific Stage specialization and the second major is in an opted discipline. The approach to the design and implementation of ITEP are:

- Education in Multidisciplinary Environment
- 4 Year duration after grade 12 of the school system
- Admission through National Common Entrance Test (NCET) conducted by NTA
- Minimal degree qualification to become a teacher by 2030
- Responsive to new 5+3+3+4 design
- Introduction of Credit System as per UGC
- Integrated Dual-Major Degree- Disciplinary & Professional Knowledge of Education
- Focus on 21st Century Skills
- Stage Specialization (5+3+3+4): Each student will specialize in one of the following school stages which will qualify them to become teachers of that Stage:
 - i) Foundational Stage Specialization (for teaching Pre-School to Grade 2)
 - ii) Preparatory Stage Specialization (for teaching Grades 3 to Grade 5)
 - iii) Middle Stage Specialization (for teaching Grades 6 to Grade 8)
 - iv) Secondary Stage Specialization (for teaching Grades 9 to Grade 12)

A list of participating institutions is given in Appendix 1.

1.4. Role of NTA

The role of NTA is confined to the registration of candidates, the conduct of the test, hosting of answer keys, inviting challenges, finalizing answer keys, preparing and declaring result, and hosting Score Card.

Merit list will be prepared by the aforesaid participating Universities/ Institutions/ Government Colleges, they may conduct their individual counselling on the basis of the score card of NCET 2023 provided by NTA.

The letters/e-mails/grievances/queries/RTI applications/Court cases pertaining to admission related matters/procedures will not be entertained by NTA. The same may be addressed to the concerned University/ Institutions/ Government Colleges.



"In order to maintain uniform standards for Teacher Education, the admission to pre-service teacher preparation programmes shall be through suitable subject and aptitude test conducted by the National Testing Agency and shall be standardized keeping in view the linguistic and cultural diversity of the country". The 4-year integrated B.Ed. will be a dual-major holistic bachelor's degree, in Education as well as a specialized subject (such as language, history, music, mathematics, computer science, chemistry, economics, art, physical-education, etc). Beyond the teaching of cutting-edge pedagogy, the teacher education will include grounding in sociology, history, science, psychology, early childhood care and education, foundational literacy and numeracy, knowledge of India and its values/ethos/art/traditions, and more.

CHAPTER – 3 ELIGIBILITY AND NCTE RECOGNIZED INSTITUTION

3.1. Eligibility

For appearing in the NCET 2023, there **is no age limit** for the candidates. The candidates who have passed the class 12 /equivalent examination or are appearing in 2023 irrespective of their age can appear in NCET 2023 examination. *However, the candidates will be required to fulfill the age criteria (if any) of the University / Institution / Government College to which they are desirous of taking admission.*

3.2. List of Qualifying Examinations (QE)

- i. The **final examination of the 10+2 system**, conducted by any recognized Central/ State Board, such as the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi; Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations, New Delhi; etc.
- ii. **Intermediate or two-year Pre-University** examination conducted by a recognized Board/ University.
- iii. Final examination of the two-year course of the Joint Services Wing of the National Defence Academy
- iv. Senior Secondary School Examination conducted by the National Institute of Open Schooling with a minimum of **five** subjects.
- v. Any Public School/ Board/ University examination in India or any foreign country is recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- vi. Higher Secondary Certificate Vocational Examination.
- vii. Candidates who have completed the Class 12 (or equivalent) examination outside India or from a Board not specified above should produce a certificate from the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) to the effect that the examination they have passed is equivalent to the Class 12 Examination.

3.3. Year of Appearance in Qualifying Examination

For year of appearance in Class 12 / equivalent examination, relevant conditions of Central/State University/Institutions which also include IITs, NITs, RIEs and Government Colleges (as applicable) will be applied. The candidate must ensure his eligibility from the website of respective Central/State University/Institutions which also include IITs, NITs, RIEs and Government Colleges



3.4. NCTE Recognized Universities/Institutions

Region-wise HEIs (Central/State Universities/Institutions including IITs, NITs, RIEs) for 4-Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme. For admission in Central/State Universities/Institutions which also include IITs, NITs, and RIEs through NCET 2023, the existing policies regarding quota, category, relaxation, reservations, qualification, subject combinations, preferences, etc. of the respective University / Institution / Government College shall be applicable.
- 2. As the eligibility criteria for admission may be unique for every University/Institution, the candidates are advised to visit the University website to which they are applying for their respective programs.
- 3. Candidates are advised to satisfy themselves before applying that they possess the eligibility criteria laid down by the University they are applying to.
- 4. Mere appearance in the Entrance Test or securing passing marks on the test does not entitle a candidate to be considered for admission to the Programme unless he/she fulfills the Programme wise eligibility conditions of the University they are applying to.



CHAPTER – 4 RESERVATIONS

4.1. Indian nationals belonging to certain categories are admitted under the seats reserved for them in accordance with the rules prescribed by the Government of India.

However, in the case of the Central Universities, the reservation policy of the respective University shall be applicable.

4.1.1. For Candidates claiming to the GEN-EWS category

GEN-EWS certificate (**Annexure-IA**) needs to be uploaded in the Online Application Form of NCET 2023 which should have been issued on or after **01 April 2022** in consonance with the latest guidelines of the Government of India.

If any GEN-EWS candidate fails to submit the GEN-EWS certificate (issued on or after **01 April 2022**) at the time of online registration, the candidate has to upload a declaration [Declaration in Lieu of Gen-EWS Certificate at **Annexure-IB**] to that effect (Reference: **No.F.No.20013/01/2018-BC-II**).

4.1.2. For Candidates claiming to the OBC-NCL category

OBC-NCL certificate (**Annexure-IIA**) needs to be uploaded in the Online Application Form of NCET 2023 which should have been issued in consonance with the latest guidelines of the Government of India.

If any OBC-NCL candidate fails to upload the OBC-NCL certificate (issued on or after **01 April 2022**) at the time of online registration, the candidate has to upload a declaration [Declaration in Lieu of OBC-NCL Certificate as per **Annexure-IIB**] to that effect. Visit **http://www.ncbc.nic.in** for the latest guidelines and updates on the Central List of State-wise OBCs.

4.1.3. For Candidates claiming to the SC or ST category

The caste (for SC) or tribe (for ST) certificate (**Annexure-III**) needs to be uploaded in the Online Application Form of NCET 2023, as per the latest guidelines of the Government of India.

4.1.4 Provisions relating to Persons with Disability (PwD)

(a) Guidelines for conducting written examination for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities above 40% vide letter dated 29 August 2018 from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment

Provisions relating to Persons with Disability (PwD):

As per Section 2(t) of the RPwD Act, "Persons with Disability (PwD)" means a person with a long-term physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory impairment which, in interaction with barriers, hinders his full and effective participation in society equally with others.

According to Section 2(r) of the RPwD Act, 2016, "*persons with benchmark disabilities*" means **a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability** where the specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.

Facilities for PwBD candidates to appear in the exam

As per the guidelines issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment issued from time to time on the subject: "Written Examination for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities", for the candidate with one of the benchmark disabilities [as defined in Section 2(r) of RPwD Act, 2016], holding a Disability Certificate in the prescribed format in the Rights of Person with Disabilities Rules, 2017

- a. *The facility of a Scribe*, in case he/she has a **physical limitation and a scribe is essential to write the examination on his/her behalf**, being so certified in the aforesaid format by a CMO/Civil Surgeon/ Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care Institution.
- b. *Compensatory time* of **one hour** for examination of **three hours** duration, whether such candidate uses the facility of Scribe or not.

Services of a Scribe

As per the office memorandum of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (Reference: F.No. 34-02/2015-DD-III dated August 29, 2018), the PwD candidates who are visually impaired OR have a disability in the upper limbs OR have lost fingers/hands thereby preventing them from properly operating the Computer Based Test platform may avail the services of a scribe (amanuensis).

The scribe will help the Candidate in reading the questions and/or keying in the answers as per the directions of the Candidate. A scribe will NEITHER explain the questions NOR suggest any solutions.

PwBD candidates who desire to avail the services of a scribe need to opt for this during the online registration of NCET – 2023.

It is to be noted that the Scribe will be provided by the National Testing Agency (NTA) if requested.

If it is found at any stage that a candidate has availed the services of a scribe and/or availed the compensatory time but does not possess the extent of disability that warrants the use of a scribe and/or grant of compensatory time, the candidate will be excluded from the process of evaluation, ranking, counselling, and admission. In case such a candidate has already been admitted to any Institution, the admission of the candidate will be cancelled.



The NTA does not guarantee any change in the category or sub-category (PwD status) after the submission of the Online Application Form, and in any case, no change will be entertained by NTA after the declaration of NTA Score for NCET 2023. The category/sub-category (PwD status) entered in the NCET Database by the candidate may be used by the participating University / Institution / Organization). Therefore, the candidates are advised to fill in the category/sub-category column very carefully.

Note:

- 1. The minimum degree of disability should be **40%** (**Benchmark Disability**) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability.
- 2. The extent of "specified disability" in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the "Guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the **Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016)**" notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)] on 4 January 2018.
- 3. No change in the category will be entertained after the last date specified by NTA for NCET 2023 Registration.

Candidates must note that the benefit of reservation will be given to them subject to verification of documents. If it is discovered at any stage that a candidate has used a false/fake/incorrect document or has furnished false, incorrect, or incomplete information, in order to avail the benefit of reservation, then such a candidate shall be excluded from all admission processes. In case such a candidate has already been given admission, the admission shall stand cancelled.

4.1.4 (b) Guidelines for conducting written examination for persons with specified disabilities covered under the definition of Section 2(s) of the RPwD Act, 2016 but not covered under the definition of Section 2(r) of the said Act, i.e. persons having less than 40% disability and having difficulty in writing

- I. These guidelines may be called Guidelines for conducting written examinations for persons with specified disabilities covered under the definition of Section 2(s) of the RPwD Act, 2016 but not covered under the definition of Section 2(r) of the said Act, i.e. persons having less than 40% disability and having difficulty in writing.
- II. The facility of scribe and/or compensatory time shall be granted solely to those having difficulty in writing subject to the production of a certificate to the effect that person concerned has limitation to write and that scribe is essential to write examination on his/her behalf from the competent medical authority of a Government healthcare institution as per performa.
- III. The medical authority for the purpose of certification as mentioned in point (II) above should be a multi-member authority comprising the following:-
- i. Chief Medical officer/Civil Surgeon/Chief District Medical Officer.....Chairperson
- ii. Orthopaedic/PMR specialist
- iii. Neurologist, if available*
- iv. Clinical Psychologist/Rehabilitation Psychologist/ Psychiatrist/Special Educator
- v. Occupational therapist, if available*



- vi. Any other expert based on the condition of the candidate as may be nominated by the Chairperson. (* the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Chief District Medical Officer may make full efforts for inclusion of neurologists, occupational therapists from the nearest District or the Medical College/Institute if the same is not available in the District)"
- IV. Compensatory time of not less than 20 minutes per hour of the examination should be allowed for persons who are eligible for getting a scribe. In case the duration of the examination is less than an hour, then the duration of the compensatory time should be allowed on a pro-rata basis. Compensatory time should not be less than 5 minutes and should be in the multiple of 5.
- **4.2** In the case of the Institutes run/aided/recognized by State Governments, the reservation policy of the respective State Governments shall be applicable.

Note: For admission in Universities through NCET 2023, the existing policies regarding reservations, relaxation, quota, category, qualification, subject combinations, preferences etc. of the respective University shall be applicable.

The NTA does not entertain any change in the category or sub-category (PwBD status) after the submission of the Online Application Form, and in any case, no change will be entertained by NTA after the declaration of NTA Score for NCET 2023. The category/sub-category (PwBD status) entered in the NCET 2023 Application Form by the candidate will be used for the NCET 2023. Therefore, the candidates are advised to fill in the category/sub-category column very carefully.



CHAPTER – 5 CHOICE OF CITIES

The Cities where the NCET 2023 will be conducted are given in **Appendix III**. While applying, candidates have to **select any two cities of their choice**. Efforts will be made to allot the city of examination to the candidates in the order of preference opted by them in their online Application Form. **However, due to administrative/logistic reasons, a different city can be allotted.**

Choice of Centre Cities will be limited to the State of Permanent Address or State of Present Address only.

In case, there are very few candidates from a City, the NTA reserves the right to merge one, two, or more cities.

The decision of the NTA regarding the allotment of the City/Centre shall be final. No further correspondence or request shall be entertained in this regard.

While filling up the Online Application Form, candidates should select **any two Convenient Cities** from **Appendix I** as their Choice of Cities for the exam Centre in order of their priority.

For convenience, the candidates may select their own city or neighbouring cities in their State of Residence only and not for far away cities in other States. **NTA** will not be responsible for any inconvenience due to the incorrect selection of cities by the candidates.

In case, the number of candidates opting for a city as a centre with a regional language is less than a certain minimum, candidates may be allotted a Centre in another city irrespective of the city opted by the candidates for appearing in the examination.

Though every effort will be made to allot a Centre in one of the cities selected by the candidate, the NTA reserves the right to allot a centre in a city other than the candidate's choice.

Allotment of Centres will be done mostly in one of the preferred cities of the candidates and there will be no human intervention.

Note: All efforts will be made by NTA to consider the comfort and convenience of candidates, including PwD Candidates while allotting Centres.



CHAPTER –6 ADMIT CARD

e-Admit Card

The e-Admit Card would be issued provisionally to the candidates through the NTA website: https://ncet.samarth.ac.in/, subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility conditions and receipt of the prescribed application fee by NTA.

The candidate has to download the Admit Card from the NTA website. The candidate will appear in the examination at the given Centre on the date and shift/timing as indicated in his/her e-Admit Card.

No candidate will be allowed to appear at the examination Centre, on the date and shift/time other than that allotted to him/her in his/her Admit Card.

In case a candidate is unable to download his/her Admit Card from the website, he/she should approach the NTA Help Line Number: 011-40759000 or 011-69227700 between 10.00 A.M. and 5.00 P.M. The candidates are advised to read the instructions on the Admit Card carefully and strictly follow them during the examination.

In case of any discrepancy in the particulars of the candidate or his/her photograph and signature shown in the e-Admit Card and Confirmation Page, the candidate may immediately **approach the NTA Help** Line between 10.00 A.M. and 5.00 P.M. In such a case, the candidate would appear in the examination with the already downloaded Admit Card. However, NTA will take necessary action to make corrections in the record later.

The date of downloading the Admit Card for the exam will be announced on the NTA website (https://ncet.samarth.ac.in/)

Note:

- a. The Candidates may please note that Admit Cards will not be sent by post.
- b. In no case, the duplicate Admit Card for National Common Entrance Test 2023 would be issued at the Examination Centres.
- c. The candidates must not mutilate the Admit Card or change any entry made therein.
- d. Candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Cards in good condition for future reference.
- e. No Admit Card shall be issued to the candidates whose applications are found to be incomplete for any reasons (including indistinct/ doubtful photographs/unsigned Applications) or who do not fulfill the eligibility criteria for the examination.
- f. Issue of Admit Cards, however, shall not necessarily mean acceptance of eligibility which shall be further scrutinized at subsequent stages of the admission process.

CHAPTER – 9 IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CANDIDATES

- 1. Candidates are advised to report at the Examination Center well in time i.e. 2 hours before commencement of the examination.
- 2. Candidates should take their seats immediately after the opening of the Examination Hall. If the candidates do not report in time due to any reason i.e. traffic jam, train/bus delay, etc, they are likely to miss some of the important instructions to be announced in the Examination Rooms/Halls. The NTA shall not be responsible for any delay.
- 3. The candidate must show, on-demand, the Admit Card downloaded/printed from the NTA website for admission in the examination room/hall. The Test Centre Staff on duty is authorized to verify the identity of candidates and may take steps to verify and confirm the identity credentials. Candidates are requested to extend their full cooperation. A candidate who does not possess a valid Admit Card and authorized Photo ID shall not be permitted to take the examination under any circumstances by the Centre Superintendent.
- 4. A seat indicating Roll Number will be allotted to each candidate. Candidates should find and sit in their allocated seats only. In case a candidate ventures to change his/her seat and does not sit on the seat allotted to him/her could face cancellation of candidature. No plea would be entertained in this regard.
- 5. The candidate should ensure that the Question Paper available on the computer is as per his/her opted subject indicated in the Admit Card. In case, the subject of the Question Paper is other than his/her opted subject, the same may be brought to the notice of the Invigilator concerned.
- 6. The candidates may approach the Centre Superintendent/Invigilator in the room for any technical assistance, first aid emergency, or any other information during the course of the examination. For any queries or issues regarding the Computer Based Test, the candidates may contact Helpline Numbers available on the NTA website.
- 7. In case a candidate, by furnishing false information, appears in more than one shift/date, his candidature will be cancelled and his result will not be declared.
- 8. For those who are unable to appear on the scheduled date of the test for any reason, a re-test shall not be held by the NTA under any circumstances.

Note: Candidates shall appear at their own cost at the Centre on the Date, Tests/ Subjects, and Timing of Examination as indicated in their Admit Card issued by the NTA. Under no circumstances the choice of cities for the Centre and Timing of Examination provided in the Admit Card shall be changed.


Candidates **MUST** *bring the following documents on the day of examination at the test centre. Candidates who will not bring these will not be allowed to sit in the examination.*

- a. Print copy of Admit Card along with Self Declaration (Undertaking) downloaded from the NTA Website (a clear printout on A4 size paper) duly filled in.
- b. One passport size photograph (same as uploaded on the Online Application Form) for pasting on the specific space in the Attendance Sheet at Centre during the examination.
- c. Any one of the authorized photo IDs (must be original, valid, and non-expired) School Identity Card/ PAN card/ Driving License/ Voter ID/ Passport/ Aadhaar Card (With photograph)/E-Aadhaar with photograph/ Ration Card with photograph/ Class 12 Board Admit Card with photograph/ Bank Passbook with Photograph.
- *d. PwBD* certificate issued by the authorized medical officer, if claiming the relaxation under *PwBD* category

OR

PwBD Certificate regarding physical limitation in an examination to write as per **Annexures** given in Information Bulletin, if claiming the relaxation under PwBD category.

Rough Work

All calculations/writing work is to be done only in the Rough Sheets provided at the Test Centre in the Examination Room/Hall and on completion of the test, candidates must hand over the Rough Sheets to the Invigilator on duty in the Room/Hall



CHAPTER – 10 UNFAIR MEANS PRACTICES AND BREACH OF EXAMINATION RULES

10.1. DEFINITION

Unfair Means practice is an activity that allows a candidate to gain an unfair advantage over other candidates. It includes, but is not limited to:

- Being in possession of any item or article which has been prohibited or can be used for unfair practices including any stationery item, communication device, accessories, eatable items, ornaments, or any other material or information relevant or not relevant to the examination in the paper concerned;
- b) Using someone to write an examination (impersonation) or preparing material for copying;
- c) Breaching examination rules or any direction issued by NTA in connection with NCET 2023 examination from time to time;
- d) Assisting other candidates to engage in malpractices, giving or receiving assistance of any kind directly or indirectly or attempting to do so;
- e) Contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person, other than the Examination Staff, during the examination time in the Examination Centre;
- f) Threatening any of the officials connected with the conduct of the examination or threatening any of the candidates;
- g) Using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination;
- h) Manipulation and fabrication of online documents viz. Admit Card, Rank Letter, Self-Declaration, etc.;
- i) Forceful entry in /exit from Examination Centre/Hall;
- j) Use or attempt to use an electronic device after entering the Examination Centre;
- k) Affixing/uploading of wrong/morphed photographs/signatures on the Application Form/Admit Card/Proforma;
- 1) Creating obstacles in the smooth and fair conduct of the examination.
- m) Any other malpractices declared as Unfair Means by the NTA.

10.2. PUNISHMENT FOR USING UNFAIR MEANS AND PRACTICES

If a candidate indulges in any of the above or similar practices during the course of, before, or after the examination, he/she shall be deemed to have used unfair practices and thus shall be booked under the UNFAIR MEANS (UFM) case. The candidate would be debarred for 3 years in the future and shall also be liable *for criminal action* and /or any other action as deemed fit.

10.3. CANCELLATION OF RESULT

The result of **NCET 2023** of the candidate(s) who indulges in Unfair means Practices will be cancelled and will not be declared. Similarly, the result of those candidates who appear from the Centre other than the one allotted to them or allow another candidate/person to write the exam on his behalf will be cancelled. No plea will be entertained in this regard.



CHAPTER – 11 DISPLAY OF ANSWER KEY FOR CHALLENGE

11.1. DISPLAY OF ANSWER KEY FOR CHALLENGES

- The NTA will display Provisional Answer Key of the questions on the NTA website: <u>https://ncet.samarth.ac.in/</u>, with a Public Notice, issued to this effect on the said website, to provide an opportunity to the candidates to challenge the Provisional Answer Keys with a non-refundable online payment of ₹ 200/- per question challenged as processing charges. The provisional Answer Keys are likely to be displayed for two to three days.
- 2. Only paid challenges made during stipulated time through key challenge link will be considered. Challenges without justification/evidence and those filed on any other medium other than the prescribed link will not be considered.
- 3. The NTA decision on the challenges shall be final and no further communication will be entertained. NTA will not inform the Candidates individually about the outcome of the challenges made.
- 4. The subject experts will examine all the challenges received and then a final answer key will be displayed and declared.
- 5. The result will be compiled based on the final answer key declared. No grievance with regard to answer key(s) after the declaration of the result/NTA Score of NCET 2023 will be entertained.

11.2. DISPLAY OF RECORDED RESPONSES

The NTA will display the recorded responses and Question Papers attempted by the candidates on the NTA website <u>https://ncet.samarth.ac.in/</u> prior to the declaration of the result/NTA Score. The recorded responses are likely to be displayed for two to three days.

11.3. MARKING SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

For Multiple Choice Questions: To answer a question, the candidates need to choose one option corresponding to the correct answer or the most appropriate answer. However, if any anomaly or discrepancy is found after the process of challenges of the key verification, it shall be addressed in the following manner:

- i. Correct answer or the most appropriate answer: Four marks (+4)
- ii. Any incorrect option marked will be given minus one mark (-1).
- iii. Unanswered/Marked for Review will be given no mark (0).
- iv. If more than one option is found to be correct then Four marks (+4) will be awarded to only
- v. those who have marked any of the correct options.



- vi. If all options are found to be correct then Four marks (+4) will be awarded to all those who have attempted the question.
- vii. If none of the options is found correct or a question is found to be wrong or a question is dropped, then all candidates **who have attempted the dropped question** will be given four marks (+4) marks.

11.4. USE OF SCORES OF NCET 2023 BY OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

The scores/result of NCET 2023 may be utilized by other organizations as per their eligibility criteria/norms/applicable regulations/guidelines/rules.

The University / Institution / Organization may admit any candidate who has appeared for NCET 2023 irrespective of the fact that the candidate has chosen that University / Institution / Organization in the online Application Form of NCET 2023. Moreover, the candidate must fulfill the eligibility criteria for the Course where the admission is being taken.



CHAPTER – 12

NCET 2023 NTA Score for Admissions in Central and other Participating Universities / Institutions / Government Colleges

12.1. NCET 2023 NTA SCORE

- a) For multi-shift papers, raw (actual) marks obtained by the candidates in different shifts/sessions will be converted to NTA Score.
- b) The detailed procedure for the compilation of the NTA Score is available on NTA Website and also in the Appendix-VII of the Information Bulletin.
- c) The NTA Score of NCET 2023 is valid for admission to the academic year 2023- 24 only.

12.2. RE-EVALUATION / RE-CHECKING OF RESULT

- a) The result for NCET 2023 will be processed based on the Final Answer Keys. No grievance with regard to Answer Key(s) after the Declaration of Result of NCET 2023 will be entertained.
- b) The marks obtained by a candidate will be considered further for computation of the result of NCET 2023.
- c) There shall be no re-evaluation/re-checking of the result. No correspondence in this regard shall be entertained.
- d) No Score Card will be dispatched to the candidates and the candidates are advised to download their Score Cards for NCET 2023 from the website: <u>https://ncet.samarth.ac.in</u>.

12.3. ADMISSIONS

- a) Merely appearing in NCET 2023 does not confer any right to the candidate for admission to the desirous University / Institution.
- b) The selection and admission are subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility, rank in the merit list, medical fitness, verification of original documents, and such other criteria as may be prescribed by the University.
- c) Admissions are handled at the level of each of the Central/State University/Institutions which also include IITs, NITs, RIEs, and Government Colleges for their respective programs. After the declaration of the NCET 2023 result by NTA, the respective CUs will declare the counselling/ admission schedule and merit list based on the NCET 2023 score and the other criteria of the respective University.

For all admission-related procedures/queries, the candidates are advised to refer to the website of the applied University.

d) NTA does not have any role in the preparation of the Merit List.



CHAPTER – 13 COMMON SERVICE CENTRES

13.1. COMMON SERVICE CENTRES/ FACILITATION CENTRES

Candidates who are not well conversant and face difficulties in submitting the online application due to various constraints can use the services of the Common Services Centre, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India under the Digital India initiatives of Hon'ble Prime Minister. CHAPTER – 14 MISCELLANEOUS

14.1. QUERY REDRESSAL SYSTEM (QRS)

QRS is the platform based on web technology that primarily aims to enable the submission of queries/grievances by the Registered Candidate(s) of NCET -2023. Examination with (24x7) facility for speedy and favorable redressal of queries/grievances. A Unique Registration Number will be generated for tracking the status of the queries/grievances.

The Registered Candidate(s) are advised to use the online facility for a speedy response.

14.2. CORRESPONDENCE WITH NTA

All the correspondence should preferably be addressed by e-mail. The email query shall be addressed only if it is not anonymous and contains the name, postal address, and contact number of the sender. An email containing vague or general queries and other queries as contained in the Information Bulletin shall not be entertained. Queries shall not be entertained from a person claiming to be representatives, associates, or officiates of the applicant candidate. The following information shall not be revealed by NTA:

- a. Internal documentation/status.
- b. The internal decision-making process of NTA. Any claim/counterclaim thereof.
- c. Dates and venue of internal meetings or name of the staff/officers dealing with it.
- d. Any information which cannot be revealed in the opinion of NTA.

14.3. WEEDING OUT RULES

The record of National Common Entrance Test NCET 2023. would be preserved up to **90** days from the date of declaration of the result.

14.4. LEGAL JURISDICTION

All disputes pertaining to the conduct of NCET 2023. Examination including Results shall fall within the jurisdiction of Delhi only. The Director (Admin) of the NTA shall be the official by whose designation the NTA may sue or be sued. Computer-Based Test (CBT) Guidelines

The major examinations being conducted by NTA are Computer-Based Tests (CBT). A CBT requires candidates to sit in front of a computer terminal (node) allocated to them against their Roll number and Admit card. After logging the candidate will get detailed instructions for the examinations. At the designated time of the start of the examination, the candidates will be able to proceed and see the questions on the computer screen using the computer mouse. Candidates will have the option to change/modify/edit/answers already entered at any time during the examination.

Procedure for appearing in Computer Based Test (CBT):

(Sample/mock test will be available on the NTA website: <u>www.nta.ac.in</u> for hands-on practice)

- (a) A computer terminal (node) indicating Roll Number will be allocated to each candidate. Candidates should find and sit on their allocated computers only. Any candidate found to have changed room/hall or the computer on their own other than the one allotted would lead to cancellation of candidature and no plea in this regard would be entertained.

In case the computer/mouse allotted to any candidate malfunctions anytime during the test, he/she will be immediately allotted another computer system and the time lost due to this will be adjusted in the server so as to give the candidate the full allotted time.

The on-screen computer clock counter of every candidate will be set at the server. The countdown timer on the top right side of the computer screen will display the time remaining (in minutes) available for the candidate to complete the examination. When the timer reaches zero, the examination will end by itself. The candidates will not be required to end or submit the examination.

The Question Status displayed on the bottom left screen will show the status of each question using one of the following symbols:



The question(s) "Answered and Marked for Review" status for a question indicates that the candidates would like to have a relook at that question again. A candidate has the option of answering a question and simultaneously "Marked for Review", these answers will be considered for evaluation. However, if a candidate has simply put "Marked for Review" for a question without answering it, the corresponding question marked for review without an answer will not be considered for evaluation. It may be noted that a candidate can return to any "Marked for Review" question any time during the examination by clicking on the corresponding question number icon displayed on the Question Palette of the corresponding section.

Appendix - VI

Procedure to be adopted for compilation of NTA scores for multi-session Papers (Normalization procedure based on Percentile and Equi percentile method)

Need for Normalisation

For several subjects, the NCET 2023 will be conducted in different shifts. Since the question paper for any subject in different shifts are different and it is quite possible that despite all the best possible efforts of maintaining equivalence among various question papers, the difficulty level of these question papers administered in different sessions may not be the same or similar. Some of the candidates might have ended up attempting a relatively tougher set of questions when compared to other sets. The candidates who attempted the comparatively tougher examination are likely to get lower marks as compared to those who attempted the easier one; the scores of the students across shifts are not directly comparable. There is a need for normalizing the marks across shifts to make them amenable to such comparisons.

A Committee headed by a Senior Professor from the Indian Statistical Institution Delhi and comprising Senior Professors from the Indian Institute of TechnologyDelhi and the University of Delhi had detailed deliberations to arrive at a methodology.

As already intimated in the Information Bulletin of NCET - 2022 the raw score of each candidate in each subject will be normalized using the *Equi-percentile method*. This is done separately for each subject for which the xamination is held in multiple shifts.

For each subject for which the examination is held in multiple shifts, the raw score for each candidate appearing for the subject will be converted into **NTA** *Score* (Percentile Score & Normalized Score) in the following three steps.

Step 1: Convert Raw Scores into Percentile Scores.

The percentiles are calculated separately for each shift.

- 1. Record the number of candidates who have appeared in a shift. Denote this number by N.
- 2. Sort all the candidates in one shift in decreasing order of their marks.
- 3. Note the *raw marks* for each candidate. Suppose this is denoted by *T*. Count the number of candidates in that shift whose raw scores are less than *or equal to T*. Denote this number by *m*.
- 4. The percentile score for this candidate is then calculated as:

$$\mathbf{P} = \frac{m}{N} * 100$$

Illustration:

Suppose that the examination in a certain subject is held in two different shifts, S1 and S2, say. Consider six candidates A, B, C, D, E, and F out of which A, B, and C are from shift S1 and the other three are from shift S2.



Let the raw marks of the six candidates be x_A , x_B , x_C (shift S1 marks) and y_D , , y_F (shift S2 marks).

For candidates *A*, *B*, and *C*, the percentiles are calculated using the total marks obtained by candidates appearing in shift S1 (in the same subject) as explained above.

Similarly, for candidates D, E, and F, the percentiles are calculated using the total marks obtained by candidates appearing in shift S2 (in the same subject) as explained above.

Let the respective percentiles be denoted by P_A , P_B , P_C , P_D , P_E , P_F .

The above data is summarised in the following table. The terms in red colour indicate that these are the output of this step.

Since the calculation for percentiles in any shift depends only on the data from that shift alone, there is a separate table for each shift.

Step 2: Pull-back of the percentiles to the scale of the marks for each session to geta Normalised Score.

- The data across all sessions tabulated at the end of *step 1* is collated into a single table.
- The columns for the shift-wise raw score should are kept separate.
- All the records are then sorted in decreasing order of the percentiles.

Illustration (Continued):

In the illustrative example given above, suppose that the percentiles of the six candidates satisfy

$$P_E > P_A > P_C = P_F > P_B > P_D$$

Then the collated table would look as given below:

Candidate C from shift S1 and candidate F from shift S2 have the same percentile. The relevant entries under "Raw Score S1" and "Raw Score S2" are the actual raw scores x_c and y_F respectively. This has the obvious interpretation that marks x_c of shift S1 are equivalent to marks y_F of shift S2.



Candidates A and B, appearing in shift S1, have a blank entry in column "*Raw* Score S2", as there is no corresponding candidate having exactly the same percentile from shift S2. Similarly, Candidates D and E, appearing in shiftS2, have a blank entry in column "*Raw Score S1*", as there is no corresponding candidate having exactly the same percentile from shift S1.

- In the remaining part of this *Step 2*, the blank entries in the two "*Raw Score*" columns are filled up using linear interpolation.
- Consider a record (row) whose entry in the column "*Raw Score S1*" is blank. The blank will be replaced by the interpolated score X which is calculated as:

$$X = x_1 + \frac{x_2 - x_1}{p_2 - p_1} \quad (P - p_1)$$

Where:

- P is the corresponding entry in "Percentile" column
- x_1 is the first *non-blank* entry BELOW X. i.e., $x_1 < X$ and there is no other non-blank entry in the column between x_1 and X.
- x_2 is the first *non-blank* entry ABOVE X. i.e., $x_2 > X$ and there is no other non-blank entry in the column between x_2 and X.
- p_1 is the entry in the "*Percentile*" column corresponding to x_1 from the column "*Raw Score S1*".
- p_2 is the entry in the "*Percentile*" column corresponding to x_2 from the column "*Raw Score S1*".

Note that there may be several blank entries between x_1 and x_2 .

- All the blank entries in column "*Raw Score S1*" can now be replaced by the interpolated values.
- The blank entries in column "*Raw Score S2*" are also replaced using a similar procedure.

<u>Illustration</u> (Continued):

The table in the illustrative example would look like the following, where the entries in red indicate the addition output at the end of this step.

Step3: Calculation of the Normalised Score

Now for each subject, *there is a score assigned to each percentile value for each session*. The *Normalised score*, **Z**, corresponding to a percentile value *P*, is calculated as:

Z = Average of $(u, u, u, u, \dots, u) = \frac{u_A + u_B + u_C + \dots + u_t}{t}$

Where $u_A, u_B, \dots, \dots, u_t$ denote the raw scores corresponding to the percentile P in each of different sessions
