A Historic Day of Learning and Expression

On 3rd May 2025, students of RIE Bhopal made a mark at a state-level essay writing and painting competition held at the State Museum, Bhopal. Sahil Behadke secured the 1st prize in essay writing, while 33 students from B.A. B.Ed. 6th Semester and ITEP 3rd Semester (History major) attended lectures by Padma Shri Dr. Rajpurohit on Dr. Vakankar's archaeological contributions and by Dr. Sitaram Dubey on historiography. The students also explored a museum exhibition showcasing Dr. Vakankar's discoveries. Principal Dr. Shiv Kumar Gupta congratulated the winners and appreciated the efforts of coordinator Dr. S. Pethiya.



As part of experiential learning, students from the same batches also visited the **historic sites of Sanchi and Udaigiri Caves** on 29th March 2025. The field trip was preceded by an in-depth lecture on Buddhist architecture, Jataka tales, and symbolism at Sanchi. Students participated in a group "treasure hunt" activity using worksheets designed to enhance inquiry-based learning. At Udaigiri, they observed intricate rock-cut carvings of Puranic deities, making the excursion a living lesson in heritage, history, and hands-on learning.





Regional Consultation Meet on School Mental Well-Being

RIE Bhopal organized a three-day consultation meet focusing on integrating mental health into the school ecosystem. Experts and educators explored the Whole-School Approach to support student well-being through curriculum, pedagogy, and teacher involvement.

The event featured sessions on:

- Role of empathy and inclusive teaching
- Use of screening tools and mindfulness strategies
- Importance of socio-emotional learning and early intervention
- Addressing teacher well-being and mentorship in school culture

With insights from scholars and professionals, the meet emphasized the teacher's role as a facilitator of mental resilience, aligning with NEP 2020's inclusive vision.





Working With Community (WWC) Program

Working with the community program provides experiential knowledge about the characteristics of a particular community, social structure, role of community leaders, cultural practices, educational background and level of awareness of the community, their participation in school development, etc. To achieve these objectives, the Working with Community (WWC) program was framed by RIE Bhopal in the Teacher-Training Course.

Which was organized from 29 May 2025 to 13 June 2025. In this program, 106 students of B.Ed. 2nd Semester and 52 students of B.Ed. M. Ed. 4th Semester participated. Whereas, B.Ed. 2nd Semester students participated from 29 May 2025 to 6 June 2025 and B.Ed. M. Ed. 4th Semester

During this student visited various social, cultural and educational institutions such as old age homes, orphanages, boys/girls' rehabilitation homes/Centres, SOS Children's villages, Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Special Schools, villages etc.

Apart from this, the students enthusiastically participated in street plays, debates, discussions, rallies and poster making on various social, cultural, political, educational and environmental issues. In the end, a report was prepared by all the students based on the data collected from various centres/institutions, which was presented individually.

KOICA-NCERT Dialogue on Mechatronics Education at PSSCIVE, RIE & DMS Bhopal

In a significant stride toward future-ready education and skill development, the **Korea International Cooperation Agency** (KOICA) engaged in a dynamic three-day dialogue with the constituent units of the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) — PSS Central Institute of Vocational Education (PSSCIVE), Regional Institute of Education (RIE), and

Demonstration Multipurpose School (DMS), Bhopal from 6th May to 8th May 2025. It marked a significant step toward shaping the future of students in Mechatronics. Highlights of the programme include interactive discussions on curriculum, resource materials, and list of equipment and materials, insightful lab visits, and the implementation of Mechatronics course in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the National Curriculum Framework for School Education (NCF-SE) 2023.



Delegates from **KOICA** and representatives from **PSSCIVE**, **RIE and DMS** shared valuable insights, paving the way for co-developing world-class Mechatronics labs tailored to local needs and global skill standards. Representatives from local industries were also invited to the discussion. The programme concluded with a comprehensive road map for the introduction of short and long-term courses on Mechatronics in DMS.

Echoes of Equality: RIE Bhopal Remembers Dr. Ambedkar

The 134th birth anniversary of **Bharat Ratna Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar** was commemorated with great reverence at the Regional Institute of Education (RIE), Bhopal. The event was presided over by the Principal of the institute, Professor Shiv Kumar Gupta.

The program featured Prof. Sanjay Dwivedi, former Director of IIMC and Head of Mass Communication at MCU, Bhopal, as Chief Guest, and Dr. Manoj Arya, Assistant Professor at MANIT, as Guest of Honour.

Empowering Adolescents for Viksit Bharat: National Conference at RIE Bhopal

A two-day National Conference on "Adolescent Education for Viksit Bharat: Issues, Challenges and Concerns" was organized by the NPEP Cell of RIE, Bhopal on 24-25 March 2025. The event brought together a diverse group of academicians, policymakers, practicing teachers, research scholars, and students from across the country.

The conference was coordinated by Dr. Rashmi Sharma, Associate Professor and Convener, NPEP, RIE Bhopal.








Prestigious Win for RIE Bhopal at Youth Parliament

The yoga session was led by trained yoga experts Ms. Mahadevi Chaturvedi, Mr. Jitendra Mishra, Ms. Ekta Gupta, and Mr. Nilesh Athankar, who guided participants through various asanas, pranayama, and meditation practices (Tadasana, Vrikshasana, Trikonasana, Ardha-Matsyendrasana, Vakrasana, Bhadrasana, Bhujangasana, Shalabhasana, Pavanamuktasana, Kapalabhati, Anulom-Vilom, and Bhramari).

The event witnessed active participation from approximately 75 faculty and staff of RIE Bhopal, 22 from the Demonstration Multipurpose School (DMS), 25 from PSSCIVE, 355 students of RIE, 75 students of DMS, 31 parents totalling around 583 participants.
